Course Information Sheet for entry in 2017-18 PGCert in International Primary Care Research Leadership



About the course

The course aims to foster and develop future leaders in primary care research. Designed to explore different aspects of leadership, participants are encouraged to identify their own development needs and form peer learning sets. Participants have access to current leaders in primary care research and experts in strategic leadership.

The course consists of three intensive residential meetings in Oxford: an initial five-day intensive meeting at the start of the programme in July in the first year and two subsequent two- to three-day residential meetings where participants will join previous cohort in a joint meetings in September in the second and third years. At the subsequent meetings participants will continue the work they are doing together, provide peer support for each other, meet other cohorts and follow up on the previous meeting(s). At the final meeting there is time for both joint and single cohort activities. Participants will present the results of their participation in the programme including what they have achieved over the two years and where this is leading. Between meetings there is ongoing contact as part of the peer learning set.

There will be a formative assessment of the presentation of own research and leadership progress as appropriate at each of the residential meetings. This is followed by a summative assessment of a written assignment of not more than 4,000 words six weeks after the residential meetings.

The course learning outcomes are achieved through lectures, practical sessions, guided reading, course assignments and expert lectures.
