# Research highlight: Fish genes hold the key to repairing damaged hearts

The Mexican tetra fish can repair its heart after damage — something researchers have been striving to achieve in humans for years. The research, led by Dr Mathilda Mommersteeg and her

team at the University of Oxford, has been published in Cell Reports and suggests that a gene called Irrc10 may hold the key to this fish's remarkable ability.
